Comrade Luis Corvalan, Secretary General of the Communist Party of Chile, has requested CC CPSU (message enclosed herewith) that the USSR accommodate  $\underline{20}$  CPC activists and provide them with a course of training in clandestine techniques; also for  $\underline{8}$  comrades, in 1980-81, who will be dispatched to Chile to help enhance the active party leadership.

We believe it expedient to grant the request of Comrade L. Corvalan.
